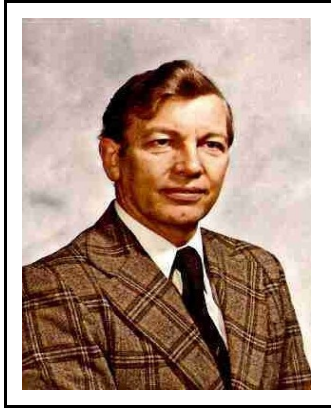


Maxwell Mullett ACER-CART President 1998-99 Biography



Maxwell Mullett entered the teaching profession in 1949-50. He was a graduate of Memorial University (B.A. and B. Ed.), Mount Allison University (B.A.) and the University of New Brunswick (M. Ed.). He taught in various places in eastern Newfoundland and was the first principal of Central High School (Grades 8-11) when it opened in 1959. He retired in 1985 in Corner Brook where he had been teaching for 21 years.

Upon retirement he became a member of the RTA, later renamed the Retired Teachers Association of Newfoundland and Labrador, and served on the Executive of the Western Division for several years as Chairperson of the Newsletter Committee and a Co-Editor of "Tales Told by Teachers- Vol. 1".

In 1989 he was a delegate to a special meeting held to reorganize the RTA and at this meeting he was elected Treasurer. In 1994 he was elected President of RTANL and attended ACER-CART meetings annually as President, and later as the Past-President. In June 1998 he was elected President of ACER-CART.

Maxwell passed away on February 10, 1999. A proud family man, Maxwell and his wife, Emily, worked side by side both on the Western Division Executive and on the Provincial Executive. He served in Italy during World War 11 as a member of the 166 Royal Newfoundland Regiment, and was a longtime member of the various organizations within the Masonic Order.
