DUTY FREE: A DOCUMENTARY

<u>Duty Free</u> is a documentary film, about 70 minutes long, which has the potential to stimulate discussion about a number of senior challenges and issues. It recounts the life changing impact on a 75-year-old single female parent who suddenly loses her job because of her age and her son's involvement in helping her find a way to reclaim and rebuild her life.

Issues introduced through the film include agism and age discrimination, employment stereotypes, family and social relationships, income security, senior mental health and failure to recognize the contributions of seniors.

The Health Committee received positive comments from members who viewed the film and participated in discussions about the issues raised, prompting it to suggest consideration in initiating discussion about and awareness of the issues some seniors are or may be facing.
